Os pronomes demonstrativos são utilizados para se referir a objetos considerando a quantidade de objetos e a distância de quem está falando.

Utilizamos “this” para um objeto que esteja perto do falante, enquanto “that” é utilizado para falar de um objeto que esteja longe do falante.

“These” e “those” são utilizados para mais de um objeto que estejam perto e longe do falante, respectivamente.

“There is” e “there are” correspondem ao verbo “haver” do Português. No entanto, diferente do Português, eles possuem diferentes formas para o singular e plural.

“There is” é o verbo “haver” no singular, enquanto “there are” é o seu plural.

III. POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES AND PRONOUNS

“Possessive adjectives” são utilizados para qualificar um substantivo, estabelecendo uma relação de posse. Geralmente, localizam-se na frase próximos ao substantivo.

“Possessive pronouns” substituem o conjunto “possessive adjective + substantivo”, evitando assim repetições numa mesma frase. Além disso, eles costumam estar no final da frase ou distantes do substantivo ao qual se referem.
